Benefit fraudlands Ponteland man stiff fine and criminal record

A Ponteland man who claimed thousands of pounds in Council Tax Benefit after failing to declare over £50,000 in savings has landed himself a stiff fine and a criminal record.

Reginald Baty, of Fairney Edge, claimed over £3,000 from Castle Morpeth Borough Council over a three year period.

He was caught after routine crosschecks between the authority and the Department for Work and Pensions, which can access HM Revenue & Customs tax records. Bedlington magistrates heard the 58year-old had £55,000 spread between two savings accounts which he should have declared when claiming the henefit

Baty admitted fraudulently claiming Council Tax Benefit at South East Magistrates Court and was ordered to pay a £1,200 fine, £50 costs and compensation to the Council of £3,145, all within 28 days.

Over the last year, the Council has issued 10 cautions, had six successful prosecutions and is claiming back overpaid benefit of over £18,000.

Coun Nic Best, Executive Member for Improvement, said after the case:

"Benefit cheats give a bad name to legitimate claimants who are entitled to receive benefits. This latest court prosecution again signals our determination to catch people who are defrauding Council Tax payers in the borough.

"A simple, routine cross-check netted this latest offender and he has been given just 28 days to pay a court bill of well over £4,000, while gaining a criminal record."

Castle Morpeth Borough Council runs a Benefit Fraud Hotline, allowing members of the public to anonymously report suspected cases of fraud.

Latest NEWS from Ponteland Parish Council



This report is based on the minutes from the Council's annual meeting held on May 15.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

Mr Frank Harrington was in the Chair as the retiring Chairman of the Parish Council and he called for nominations for the position of Chairman. Coun Robin Ramsay was elected Chairman of the Parish Council and took the Chair. He expressed regards and appreciation to those who were no longer members of the new Council. This included Frank Harrington, Sheila Campbell and John Colvin, who had been stalwarts of the Parish Council for a long period of time. He also extended thanks and good wishes to Mrs Vera Lonsdale and Chris Matthew.

ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Coun David Butler was elected as Vice Chairman of the Parish Council

PUBLIC OUESTIONS

Mrs Anne Harrison raised a question querying why the splash pool at Ponteland Leisure Centre had been closed for a long period of time. This pool was much needed by certain users of the pool. She outlined details of correspondence she

had sent to both the Leisure Centre and to Castle Morpeth Borough Council and asked if there was anything the Parish Council could do to assist. The Chairman said he had spoken to the Borough Council's Director of Customer Services that afternoon and he had indicated that a letter had been sent to Mrs Harrison on 25th April. Mrs Harrison had obviously not received this letter and the Chairman arranged for a copy to be sent to her immediately. It had been agreed that a meeting would be arranged between a representative of the Borough Council, the Leisure Centre Manager and Mrs Harrison in an attempt to deal with this matter to the satisfaction of users. Councillors Ramsay and McKay would also attend this meeting.

APPOINTMENT OF ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE

The Chairman, Vice Chairman and councillors Joyce Butcher, Archie Cave, Harry McKay and John Worth were appointed to the Accounts Committee for the purpose of authorising all payments made by the Council on the Council's Deposit Account and the Community Projects Account.

CODE OF CONDUCT

It was reported that that a new Model Code of Conduct came into force from May 3. A copy of the Code had been circulated with the Declaration of Interest forms. The Code had to be available for public inspection and a notice placed in the local newspaper indicating that the Code had been adopted and listing an address at which it could be inspected.

APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS **Ponteland Youth Service**

Request for funding towards cost of providing detached youth work A grant of £5,000 was approved towards the cost of providing a detached youth service to young people in Ponteland by Ponteland Community High School Youth Service.

Request for funding towards cost of providing a Youth

A grant of £10,000 was approved towards the costs of providing a new youth centre in Ponteland by Ponteland Community High School Youth Service. The funds will be released once construction works had commenced. Coun Ramsay declared a personal interest in the above items and took no part in voting.

NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

Letter from Chief Executive of NCC re a single council for **Northumberland**

A letter had been circulated from the Chief Executive of Northumberland County Council regarding the proposals for a single unitary authority for Northumberland. He had offered to come and make a presentation concerning their proposals to a meeting of the Parish Council. The Chief **Executive of Castle Morpeth** Borough Council had agreed to come to the same meeting and present the proposals for two unitaries for the county. It was agreed that the two officers be invited to attend the same meeting on a date to be arranged and give a half hour presentation each.



Parents hold appeal night to raise funds for hospital charities A chance decision to spend a night at the in-laws in Whalton probably saved the lives of Zoë Bell and

Zoë, 22, was living at the time with husband Stephen and their baby son Jack in remote Allendale. Stephen, 27, woke to find her lying in bed at his parents' home in a pool of blood.

An ambulance was called and rushed Zoë to Newcastle's Royal Victoria Infirmary, where Lucy was born 14 weeks premature on September 9, 2005. Her due date was Christmas Eve.

Lucy weighed just 900g, or 2lb. The picture here shows just how tiny she was. Stephen, a civil engineer, said: "Lucy was about the size of a knife or fork, or a toastie bag - my wedding ring could fit around her shoulder."

She was transferred straight to the special baby care unit, put on a ventilator, and at ten days old was taken to the Freeman Hospital for a heart operation to close up a duct.

The couple had been aware there may be problems with the pregnancy, having been told there appeared to be insufficient fluid around the baby in the womb. Doctors thought she may not go full term, but no one was expecting this Christmas present to come quite so early.

Zoë said: "Had we been in Allendale that night, neither of us would be here today. And having been diagnosed with bleeding on the brain and lung disease at birth, we were worried Lucy would not survive. We are so, so lucky."

Lucy was kept at the RVI until early November, when she was transferred to Hexham General Hospital, but after just two days she had stopped breathing and had to be rushed back to the special baby care unit in Newcastle.

She fortunately made a full recovery and was allowed home for Christmas. Lucy is now 21 months old, and a very active, intelligent and happy girl who lives with her family at Town Farm Cottage in Milbourne.



The couple stayed at one of The Sick Children's Trust's 'Homes from Home' - Crawford House at the RVI during Lucy's three month stay in hospital. This meant they were just moments away from her bedside, rather than a two hour return drive, with a direct phone to the special baby care unit.

Zoë said: "They were absolutely fantastic to us – we received the

most amazing care and she wouldn't be here but for them."

To express their gratitude to the hospital and the Trust for the care and attention they all received, Zoë and Stephen have organised a "Charity Night" at The Highlander pub near Belsay, where Zoë is assistant manager.


The event is being held on Friday 3rd August,



We need your help! We are carrying out a Spring Squirrel Survey and need everyone to report recent squirrel sightings!

Please take the time to telephone, email or visit our website to log your sightings as soon as possible. Your sightings will help us gauge current numbers and locations of red squirrels in our area. It will also determine the whereabouts of any grey squirrels in the district.

Results of the survey will help us with our research and will be sent to the Wildlife Trust Save our Squirrel Project to add to their national database.

As you may be aware, our native red squirrel is under threat of extinction in Northumberland (one of the last counties on mainland UK to be home to red squirrels). Increasingly effective efforts are underway to protect this beautiful creature in our area and across the North East and West.

The **Red Squirrel Protection Partnership** is continuing to work hard to control grey squirrels, NWT SOS are helping raise awareness and local groups, such as Ponteland Red Squirrels, new groups Squirrel Action Greenhead and Ulgham Red Squirrels in Northumberland, along with several well established local Cumbrian groups are providing a vital life line for our little red friends. Above all though, our efforts would not be as effective without the cooperation and help from residents, local people and landowners

ensure that a sound, deliverable plan which maintains the character and heritage of the Village can be arrived at

We would suggest that any proposals be discussed with the Government's Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment (CABE) at an early stage.

Peacock on the loose in Darras

Appeal for witnesses to house fire

The reports of property crime have remained low since the last publication, with no house burglaries reported at all during this period.

A premises on the Meadowfield trading estate was broken into and scrap metal was taken. Two garden sheds were broken into on Darras Hall.

The majority of offences were reported during the last week in May, including a car being stolen from Thornhill Road, another damaged in Merton Way, damage to some noticeboards/windows (not high value) and five assaults.

All the violent offences have 'positive lines of enquiry' which are being followed up.

Readers should be reminded that in most of the assaults that take place in this area, the injured party will know the offender. They will often involve school pupils who will fall out over various things, a small core group of teenagers who think that the best form of social advancement is to pick on other teenagers (but always when the odds are in their favour), domestic assaults, and drink-fuelled disagreements amongst adults.

It is very rare that a total stranger will attack you without warning. It has happened in this area, but it is not the norm.

On 27th May, a fire occurred at a house under renovation on Whinfell Road during the early hours of the morning. This one is under investigation. Any information would be

welcome about this offence.

Staying with damage offences, two youths were detained in connection with the numerous windows broken at the High School last month.


